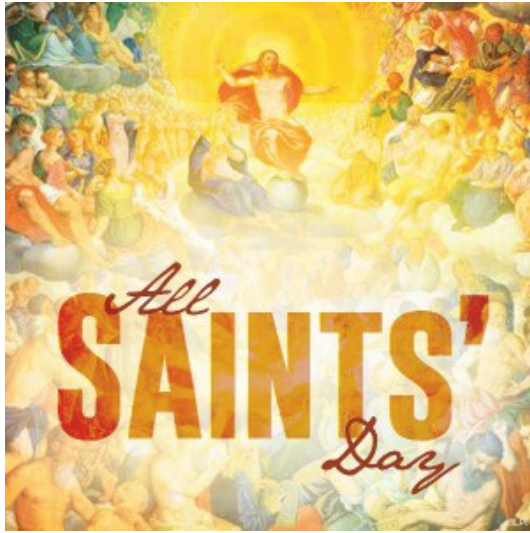


Welcome!

HOME PRAYER SERVICE November 1st – All Saints Day

Introduction: Let us reflect on the times we have not acted according to the worth God bestows on us.

All: Lord, have mercy.

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God,
born of the Father before all ages.

God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God,
begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father;

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified,
who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins
and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Leader: For awareness of God's grace at work around and within us . . . that we may recognize the work of God in those who love us . . . forgive us . . . teach us . . . and call us to be our truest selves . . . we pray:
Lord, hear our prayer.

Leader: For healing . . . that through the intercession of the saints, God will deliver the human family from the coronavirus . . . we pray:
Lord, hear our prayer.

All: Our Father who art in heaven...

Spiritual Communion

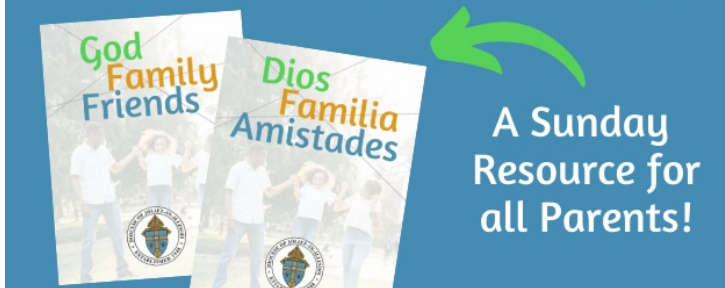
